## **DEVELOPING CONSENSUS: FIST OF FIVE**



| Five fingers  | Support idea and will give leadership |
|---------------|---------------------------------------|
| Four fingers  | Will actively support leadership      |
| Three fingers | Supporter                             |
| Two fingers   | Neutral – doesn't feel much support   |
| One finger    | Disagree but will go along            |
| Fist          | Actively opposed – cannot go along    |

- This is a great way to get a quick sense of how much support there is for an idea once a discussion has aired all opinions and it feels like there is a stalemate on the idea.
- If there is even one fist in the air, it means you need to continue the conversation to find more ways to include differences of opinion.
- If you have one or two fingers showing, you may be able to proceed, although additional discussion could be useful, depending on how strongly everyone's support is needed.
